Beginning Jewelry Making taught by Reba Rauch

JANUARY 13 - FEBRUARY 17, 7:00 - 9:00 PM

TUITION: \$75 (6 WEEKS)

This class will cover the basics of making necklaces, bracelets and earrings from purchased beads (semi-precious, glass, porcelain, metal, etc.) and jewelry components. Learn how to design and string your creations, then add clasps and/or pendants and finish the piece. Students will complete one necklace, one memory wire bracelet, and one pair of earrings during the class. A supply list will be available and students will be expected to provide their own supplies. You will leave this class with the essentials to experiment and make jewelry on your own.

REBA RAUCH began making jewelry more than a decade ago and is an accomplished artist. She has studied ornamentation form around the world and has experimented with many different styles and designs, often incorporating found objects and skills into her jewelry. Her unique sense of style has led to the creation of many coveted pieces that can be found in galleries and gift shops around the valley.

THURSDAYS

Still Life Painting in Oil taught by Chris Thornock

JANUARY 15 - FEBRUARY 19, 7:00 - 9:00 PM

TUITION: \$75 (6 WEEKS)

This class will help artists of all levels develop strong observation, drawing and painting skills, focusing on the still life genre. Students should expect to complete one or two still life paintings over the six week course. Topics that will be covered include preparing painting supports, drawing and block in, under-painting, and finishing a work. In class discussion and practice of traditional painting techniques including composition, value and color. A list of materials will be available. Please come prepared with all materials to first class. Drawing experience not necessary but is preferred.

CHRISTOPHER THORNOCK received his Bachelor of Fine Arts at Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California and his Masters at B Y U where he taught as an adjunct professor leading classes in drawing, figure drawing, painting, figure painting, watercolor to name a few. He is currently a full-time studio artist and his work is represented at several galleries. Thornock's work focuses on the traditional subjects of figure, still life and landscape.



Basic Book Design & Binding taught by Nathan Gardner

TUITION: \$75 (6 WEEKS)

Discover the lost art of book making with this very skilled artist. Nathan will guide you through the process of designing, building, and binding a journal style book. Students will be able to finish at least one book in the duration of this 6 week course. A supply list will be available but come prepared with 50 sheets of copy paper and a posterboard to first class to get started. No need to spend a lot on materials for the first class; as the course progresses, students will move on to better quality and more archival materials will be introduced.

NATHAN GARDNER holds a BFA in Fine from the U of U and has taken several bookmaking workshops from the University book arts program. He has worked as an artist since 1998 in the fields of photography, air brush illustration and painting, gilding, etching and silver point along with book binding.
